SCHOOL COUNCIL

The school council plays a role in monitoring and informing Murrumba's strategic direction in a way that achieves the best learning outcomes for students. It comprises of a representation of parents/caregivers, staff and students on the school council that play a role in approving school plans and policies of a strategic nature, or other documents affecting strategic matters including the annual estimate of revenue and expenditure for the school. Monitoring of the college's strategic direction and the implementation of the plans and policies. Also advising the college's Principal about strategic matters.

SCHOOL LEADERSHIP

Student Leadership at Murrumba State Secondary College is a program driven by the College values. These values form the very heart of our College, and student leaders provide the student vision and voice regarding: respect, pride, resilience, community and quality learning. Students from all year levels have the opportunity to step into a variety of leadership positions throughout their time at the College. The student leadership program is developed through a weekly after school session where students gather with the relevant staff to learn valuable leadership skills, develop their projects and actions plans and take some time to give back to the Murrumba and wider community. We call this rotation, Grow/Act/Give. Sitting just outside of the student leadership program is the SRC, a student run organisation that provides the community with a number of fundraising and philanthropic events throughout the year.



EXCELLENCE PROGRAMS

Engineering Excellence

An extension program in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM), presenting students with real-world engineering challenges, workshops and competitions, plus the opportunity to participate in an international study tour.

Football Academy

A pathway for talented students to develop their football skills, with numerous opportunities to represent the College in both Football and futsal at District, Metropolitan, State and National level competitions.

High Performance Music Program

Talented musicians can enhance their musical potential as performers, composers and musicologists, with a focus on a chosen instrument and composition and the chance to learn from industry professionals.

Spanish Acceleration

A Spanish extension program for selected year 7 students who will also learn history in Spanish, developing high levels of language proficiency.

Spanish Immersion

An intensive immersion program where students in years 8 to 10 receive 50% of the curriculum in Spanish.

Dance Academy

Developing technique and performance skills and including units on anatomy, nutrition, physical conditioning and personal presentation, as well as exposure to high calibre industry professionals and higher education institutions.

SPECIALISED PROGRAMS

Entrepreneurship and Innovation

A challenging business-focused program, with opportunities for business and community involvement and an emphasis on post-secondary opportunities.

CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS

Windmill Café

The Windmill Café is Murrumba's own student-run coffee shop. Students enrolled in the Certificate II/III in Hospitality have the opportunity to gain experience in multiple food service operation areas. Food preparation, plating food, customer service, barista and supervisory skills are all skills the students get practice in a fully functional café based on professional industry standards. Throughout the year students have breakfast and lunch shifts, serving fellow students and staff members. Functions are held throughout the year which are great opportunities to learn about roles within the Hospitality industry.

Instrumental Music Program

The opportunity for students to participate in individual instrumental lessons and rehearse and perform as part of ensembles.

Debating

An opportunity for those with a passion for learning & problem solving to showcase their skills & talents in an exciting, vibrant & public way within a team environment.

Student Volunteering and Community Service Program

Students can volunteer in a range of different activities, from assisting in the canteen to helping in the science laboratory or sports equipment store or volunteering at the Inverpine retirement community.

International Program

We welcome students from across the globe for study tours or longer stays, enriching the lives of our international students, their host families and the wider school community.

Esports

A team-based program with opportunities to represent the College against other schools. Students experience many of the same benefits that traditional athletics provide, such as: sportsmanship, leadership, communication and teamwork, without the drawbacks of traveling for practice, games and tournaments or risk of injury. Esports is an extra-curricula activity run by a dedicated group of teachers.

A year 12 student from Brisbane's northside is leading the way in the STEM field inspiring other young women to follow their passion after taking out a prestigious international science award.

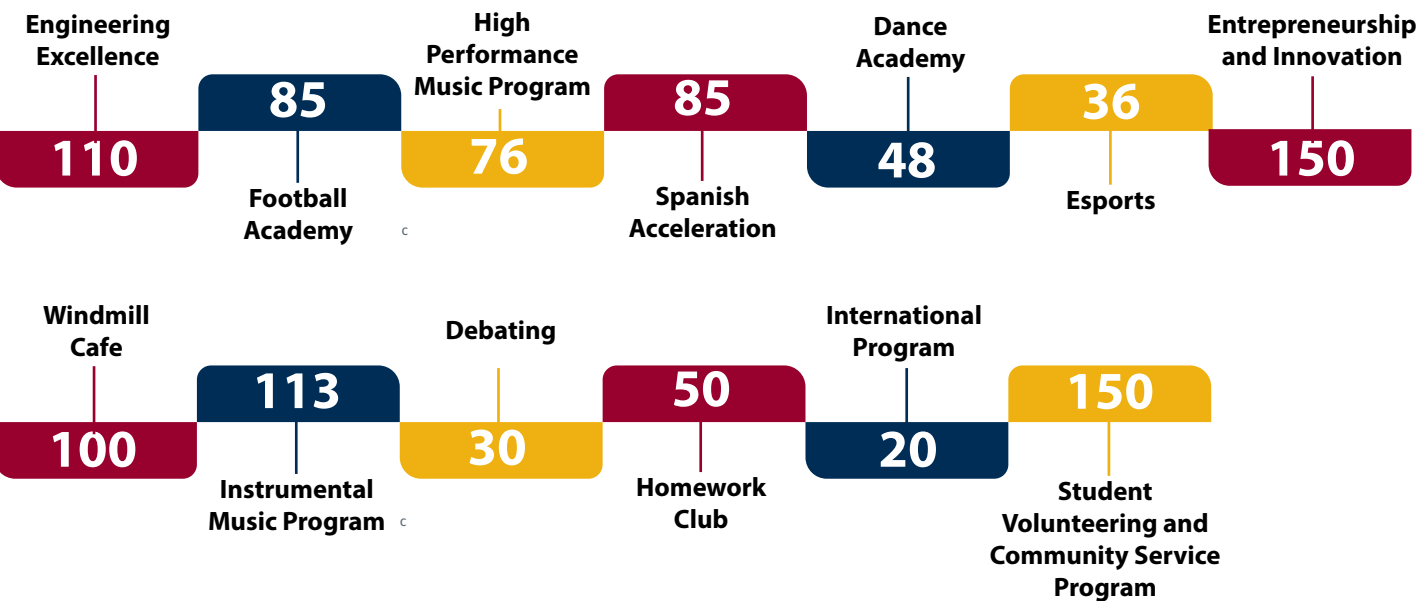

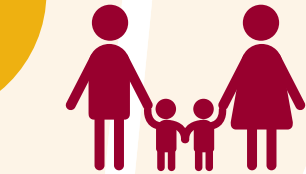
THE CATCHMENT

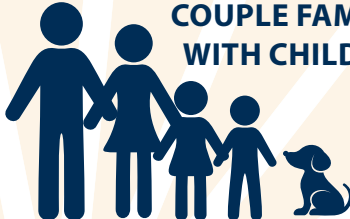

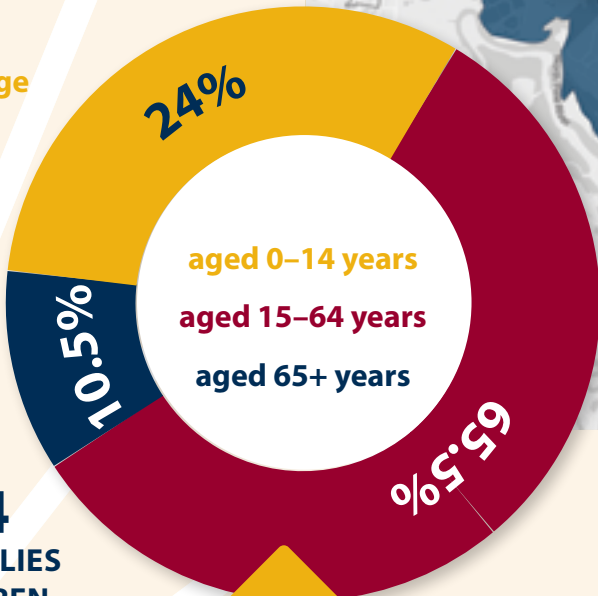

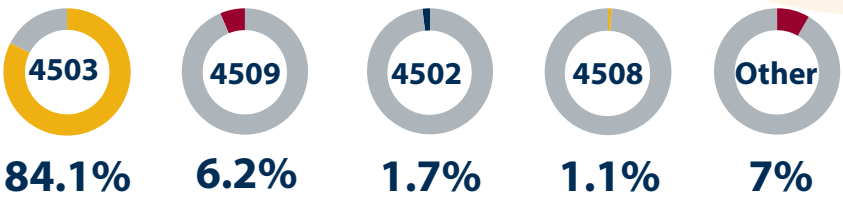

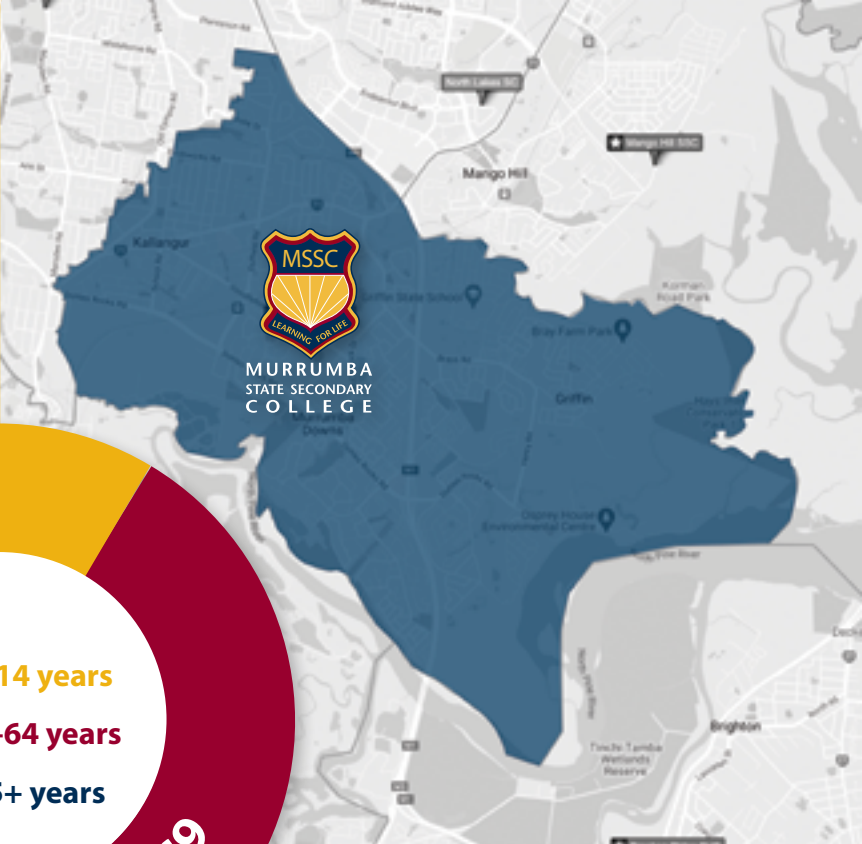
